

PUFFING BILLY RAILWAY CELEBRATES 125 YEARS WITH INAUGURAL COMMUNITY OPEN DAY ON SUNDAY 14 th

Puffing Billy, Australia's most beloved heritage train and one of the world's best preserved steam railways, is celebrating its 125th anniversary with a special Community Open Day dedicated to the local community. Throughout the day, various local community groups will host a range of engaging activities f or all attendees to enjoy. Originally launched on December 18, 1900, Puffing Billy is a treasured remnant of a more leisurely era. Built to carry goods and passengers through Victoria's mountain district, the historic railway was a vital lifeline for the region. The line, which ran between Upper Ferntree Gully and Gembrook, faced numerous challenges. By the early 1930s, it had become a financial burden for Victorian Railways, and following a major landslide in 1953, the decision was made to close the line in 1954. However, a series of farewell trips in 1955 sparked public interest and community efforts that eventually led to the line's revival. Tourist services resumed in 1962 between Belgrave and Menzies Creek, with extensions to Emerald in 1965, Lakeside in 1975, and finally Gembrook in 1998. Since its reopening, more than 11 million passengers have experienced the magic of Puffing Billy. The Inaugural Community Open Day celebrating Puffing Billy Railway's 125th anniversary will honour the rich history of the railway and its enduring impact on the local community

What's happening at The Community Hall and Over 50's centre

Our Cockatoo Community Hall was built in 1981-2 and opened in 1982. Three months later our town went through the Ash Wednesday fires, and the hall was used as a relief centre with hundreds of CFA, emergency support and volunteers eating and sleeping in the hall. The comment was made by shire officers, at that time, that the hall had seen ten years of normal use in a matter of months.

The Catholic Church diocese raised and donated \$30,000.00, after Ash Wednesday, to build a purpose built building for the Cockatoo Seniors. This was almost solely built by Paul Allan, a local architect, who raised donations and personally built the hall. He was a member of the Cockatoo seniors at that time.

Other than upkeep, very little work has been done on the building since then. Our buildings are now close to 50 years old.

The Kindergarten has grown to such an extent, they now need to use the whole of the Bailey Rd Building with extended Kindergarten hours for our children.

This means the Community house has needed to find another building to run their classes from.

A look around our community showed that the best building would be our community hall.

It is in the centre of town, allows for good parking and is under utilized. Shire applied for grants to be able to do the works at the Bailey Rd Building and to the Community Hall.

The Community Hall and Over 50's centre will be closed till at least December, and probably a little longer, whilst renovations take place.

For the Over 50's we will have a updated and freshly painted building and our members are looking forward to that.

The renovated in and around the Main hall will house the market equipment and the hall will still be able to be used by community groups outside of Community house hours.

Whilst there is an inconvenience for the users of the hall, we are excited. Our building, that is showing signs of age, will be renovated and upgraded to allow for another fifty years of use by our community.

We are in what appears to be a Win Win situation, with Kindergarten hours and kinder facility improved, a Community house closer to town, with a upgraded Community hall and Over 50's centre and that the community will have access to its hall of evenings when the hall is used by community the most.

As the Over 50's, we were only notified of this move in the last month and shire has been open in what it is basically planning. Whilst we have had little input into the plans for the buildings they have bent over backwards, to accommodate all sessions we hold and the karate group, to relocate them whilst the renovations take place.

We will keep you up to date as we know more.

Fire Danger Period commenced Monday 17 November 2025

The Country Fire Authority (CFA) has declared the Fire Danger Period (FDP) for Cardinia Shire will begin Monday 17 November.

When the Fire Danger Period has been declared, fire restrictions come into force across the municipality. The CFA details all restrictions that apply, **on their website**.

You need a permit to burn-off during the Fire Danger Period. You must also notify <u>Triple Zero Victoria</u> of your burn-off as contained in your permit. For information of your property zone and conditions that apply, please visit <u>Council's website</u>.

Ahead of this period, residents are encouraged to clean up their properties of all overgrown grass and weeds, fallen branches and dead vegetation that may present a fire hazard.

Larger rural and agricultural properties must create a firebreak at least 10 metres wide along external fences by slashing grass and weeds to less than 10 centimetres.

Cardinia Shire residents can dispose of their green waste for free at the Future Recycling Transfer Station in Pakenham.

Council has also decided to run a Community Panel, to deliberate on a review of how Cardinia applies Differential Rates and make recommendations to Council. Earlier this year, I was not successful in a bid to amend the current Differential Rates, however the Councillors did agree there ay be a need for further change to the current set-up – hence this formal process kicking off now.

I'm therefore really keen for interested people from Ranges Ward, including both 'townies' and farming families, to nominate for that Panel, grapple with the problem and help the Panel work-out a possible way forward that is a fairer way to raise the funds Council needs, to continue to deliver the range of services residents access.

The Gembrook Community Group will help everyone co-ordinate the days and lend a hand where we can.


The current timetable (subject to change) looks like this:

- Improved assessment of risks associated with onsite wastewater systems.
- Enhanced management strategies to minimize potential discharges beyond property boundaries.

Clear guidelines and timelines for addressing non-compliance issues.

Residents are encouraged to review the draft Onsite Wastewater Management Plan and share their feedback. Feedback is essential to ensure the final plan truly meets the community's needs and aspirations.

Cardinia Shire Pedestrian and Bicycle Strategy review

Cardinia Shire Council is reviewing the Pedestrian and Bicycle Strategy to improve how residents walk, cycle, and move throughout the shire.

This review of the Pedestrian and Bicycle Strategy aims to create safer, more connected, and accessible paths and trails across the shire, ensuring a vibrant and active lifestyle for all.

The community is invited to participate in this review by sharing their experiences and ideas through an online survey and an interactive map highlighting areas for improvement or showcasing great places to walk or ride. Whether you are a regular walker, an avid cyclist, or a nature enthusiast, your insights will play a crucial role in shaping the future of our active transport network. Council is looking to understand which infrastructure works well, what needs improvement, and what new connections or upgrades residents would like to see.

Cardinia Shire Mayor, Councillor Jack Kowarzik, encourages the community to share their experiences and suggestions to help shape how we walk and ride through the shire.

"We want to hear from our community about what matters most to them when walking and riding in the shire. Your feedback will help us prioritise and shape the expansion of our active transport networks throughout the area," said Mayor Kowarzik. "By working together, we can enhance the liveability of Cardinia Shire by improving recreational opportunities for active transport. I encourage everyone to share their experiences and suggestions as we strive to create a vibrant community where walking and riding are enjoyable for all."

The review will focus on shared paths and trails, both existing and proposed, facilitating informal walking and cycling for recreation and transport.

The review builds on the foundations laid in the original Pedestrian and Bicycle Strategy developed in 2007 and updated in 2017. The 2017 Strategy successfully outlined a preferred network, identified regional trails, and established minimum infrastructure standards. However, as our community continues to grow with evolving community needs, a fresh review is essential to ensure that the strategy remains relevant and inclusive.

This initial ideas-gathering consultation will assist Council in developing a new draft Pedestrian and Bicycle Strategy, which will be presented to the community for further feedback in early 2026.

The final strategy will serve as a guiding framework for Council's future planning and investment in walking and cycling infrastructure, ultimately enhancing connections and promoting a healthier lifestyle for all residents in Cardinia Shire.

- Outdoor exercise stations along Heritage Springs Linear Reserve: There are currently six outdoor exercise equipment stations dotted along the shared path, between Primary Springs Primary School and Winneke Way.
- The Flying Fox at Toomuc Creek Linear Reserve: Toomuc Creek Linear Reserve runs along Toomuc Creek between Princes Highway and Princes Freeway. A concrete shared path runs along both sides of the creek. The flying fox for renewal is located near the intersection of Growler Street and Victory Drive.

Possum Place playground: This playground is part of the Heritage Springs Linear Park (at western end) accessible from Sundew Crescent, Possum Place and Winneke Way, Pakenham. It has basic play equipment: slides, swings (including toddler swing), and a climbing frame. It is a few metres walk to the Flying Fox along Toomuc Reserve. Upgrades are pending future budget approval.

Community members are encouraged to share how they currently use the facilities and suggest improvements they'd like to see. Feedback gathered during the consultation will inform the design process and ensure the renewed assets meet the needs of the growing community.

Businesses that secure a permit will be able to serve park visitors from a prime location in the dedicated food truck area, bringing delightful treats and refreshments to those enjoying the natural surroundings. Business operators will be required to apply for a Roadside Trading Permit.
