The Icy Pole Run

The annual Cockatoo Rural Fire Brigade icy pole run kicked off on Christmas Eve (Wednesday) at 2.30PM.

Do you know the history behind the icy pole run and why our Brigade doesn't do a Santa run like many other Brigades?

Well...

In 1983, Cockatoo was significantly impacted by the Ash Wednesday bushfires, which resulted in the loss of six lives, 307 houses and other buildings, and a total area burnt of 1,800 hectares.

This disaster was etched in the memory of young and old and remains with some of our current residents today.

Before the days of understanding the now-diagnosis of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), or "shell shock" as it was referred to when troops from World War 1 returned home, an association of fire trucks and bad outcomes was formed.

To regain the positive association with the Brigade and the big red trucks (BRTs), the icy pole run was developed later that same year so that children could have some joy and on the flip-side Brigade members could too.

This tradition lives on strong in our community as we remember the tragedy of Ash Wednesday in 1983 and our current-day Brigade members absolutely revel in the community engagement and bringing smiles to children (young and old).

The Ash Wednesday Bushfire Education Centre (AWBEC) can be visited to look back on this tragic day, and to learn how to prepare yourselves and your loved ones should our beautiful town be tested again.

We wish everyone of our community members a Merry Christmas and hope you have a safe and fun time of year.

What are the benefits of having your own live chickens?

Having your own live chickens can give you fresher eggs, better garden fertility and pest control, reduced food waste, and surprisingly engaging, low-cost pets. Many people also value the environmental and educational benefits of a small backyard flock.

Food and nutrition



Regular supply of very fresh eggs, often daily from good layers. Backyard eggs are often higher in some nutrients like vitamin D and certain vitamins compared with typical super-market eggs, especially when hens are well-fed and allowed to range. You know exactly how the birds are treated and what they are fed, which can matter if you care about humane and low-chemical production.^{[4][7][3]}

Garden and waste benefits

Chickens provide high-nutrient manure that becomes excellent compost and fertiliser once aged, improving soil structure, moisture retention, and plant health. They help with pest control by eating insects, slugs, larvae, and some weeds, reducing the need for chemical pesticides in vegetable beds and orchards. A flock can significantly cut kitchen scraps and garden waste going to landfill, because many leftovers can be safely fed to hens.^{[1][3][4]}

Cost and sustainability

After setup, chickens are relatively low-cost pets; feed and bedding are the main ongoing expenses, partly offset by savings on eggs and garden fertilizer. Producing your own eggs reduces reliance on factory-farmed eggs and lowers transport, packaging, and refrigeration impacts, shrinking your household's carbon footprint. Surplus eggs can sometimes be sold or swapped locally, helping with grocery costs and supporting more **local** food systems.

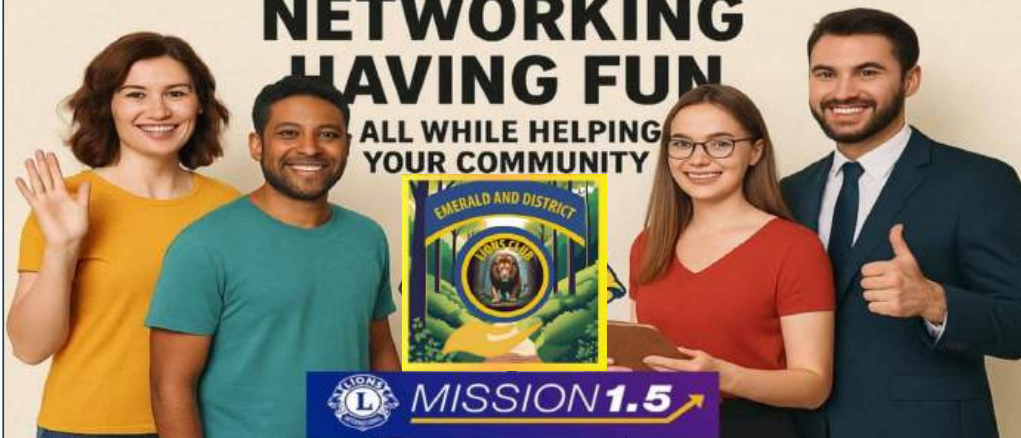

A revitalised Pakenham

Construction is progressing on Stage 1 of Pakenham Revitalisation with works underway on Drake Place near the Railway Hotel.

Cardinia Shire Deputy Mayor and Henty Ward Councillor, Liz Roberts is proud to see progress being made on the streetscape upgrades, and to see how Council has worked with local businesses to minimise disruptions so far.

“We’re committed to working with businesses to find the best ways to support them through our works in Pakenham.”

“Council is meeting regularly with impacted businesses to do this and have so far, been able to make meaningful changes to our construction schedule from the feedback provided.” Cr Roberts said.

To help minimise impacts, maintain access and encourage greater connectivity to businesses and services in the area, Council has broken down stage 1 works into 6 smaller phases.

“We understand that December and early January is a busy time for businesses in Pakenham’s town centre, so we’ve made adjustments and planned our works with this in mind.” Cr Roberts said.

From Monday 8 December, works on Drake Place will be paused to reduce disruptions from Council over Christmas, encouraging the community to shop local. In addition to the works being paused, Drake Place will be temporarily reopened, which will include the reinstatement of two-way traffic in and out, parking bays and a new footpath. This change will reduce congestion and support access around the town centre.

As the festive season approaches, the Pakenham Revitalisation project is encouraging the community to shop local and support the businesses that make Pakenham vibrant and unique.

If you’re hunting for the perfect Christmas gifts, Pakenham has everything you need right on your doorstep. From fashion boutiques offering clothing and footwear, to toy stores for the little ones, and specialty shops for hobbies, crafts, and home décor, there’s something for everyone. You’ll also find jewellery stores, beauty and wellness services, and plenty of cafés and restaurants to relax and enjoy a festive meal or coffee break while you shop.

“Shopping locally not only helps small businesses thrive but also strengthens our local economy, creates jobs, and builds a stronger, more connected community.” Cr Roberts said.

While our works are on pause, Pakenham Rotary Club will be spreading the festive spirit by installing almost 20 Christmas trees down Main Street, Pakenham. Supported by a \$1,000 Small Change Wellbeing Support Grant from Cardinia Shire Council, the trees will be decorated by the community to help establish Pakenham as a place for all people to live, work, play and visit.

“This season let’s celebrate Pakenham by choosing local. Whether you’re buying gifts, dining out, or sourcing everyday essentials, make Pakenham your first choice.” Cr Roberts said.

Works are expected to restart on both sides of Drake Place from early January 2026, and stage 1 works are expected to be completed by mid-2026.

MAKING IT EASIER FOR VICTORIANS TO GET CARE AT THE CHEMIST



Friday, 19 December 2025

Victorians will now be able to get more conditions treated at the chemist – with the Allan Labor Government expanding its Chemist Care Now program.

Minister for Health Mary-Anne Thomas today joined the team at Richmond Traders Price-line to announce new conditions have been added to the program – helping Victorians avoid an unnecessary trip to the doctor while freeing up GPs to see people with more complex conditions.

With consultations remaining free, busy families will now be able to seek treatment for the common skin infection impetigo, known as ‘school sores’ – making it easier to get their kids the care they need.

Access to affordable and convenient care for Victorian women will be strengthened, with the addition of two new hormonal contraceptives options – the injectable depot and the vaginal ring – available for resupply, without needing a prescription.

Women experiencing menopause will also benefit, with pharmacists able to provide a resupply of hormone replacement therapy (HRT) without a prescription later next year.

Over the next two years, Chemist Care Now will grow to include 22 treatments for common health conditions – with participating pharmacists able to undertake short-form training to deliver each new service.

It builds on the existing program which currently offers treatment for uncomplicated urinary tract infections, skin conditions such as shingles, travel vaccines including hepatitis A and B, and the resupply of the contraceptive pill.

Following a successful pilot, the Labor Government made Chemist Care Now permanent earlier this year, supported by a \$18 million investment in the *Victorian Budget 2025/26*.

It has been a clear winner with Victorians – delivering more than 66,000 services at more than 800 pharmacies across Victoria since the pilot began.

To support the program, the Labor Government also recently announced the Graduate Certificate of Pharmacist Prescribing at Monash University – a new training pathway for more pharmacists to participate.

The course is accredited by the Australian Pharmacy Council and adds to courses developed by the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia and other training organisations.

The Chemist Care Now program adds to other Labor Government initiatives including 29 Urgent Care Clinics, and the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department, making care easier to access for all Victorians.

Council welcomes Victorian Government funding to expand kindergarten places in Cockatoo

Cardinia Shire Council is pleased to announce that Cockatoo Kindergarten will soon benefit from additional kindergarten places and upgraded facilities, with support from the Victorian Government.

Located at 23 Bailey Road Cockatoo, the kindergarten will undergo significant improvements including:

- Upgrades to the existing community room into a licensed 33-place kindergarten room and integrating the existing kindergarten room and shared indoor/outdoor spaces, all under the existing roofline.
- Upgrades to amenities to meet the latest accessibility and compliance standards.

Renewal of existing kindergarten room, including upgraded children's amenities to improve accessibility, inclusion and functionality.

These upgrades will enable the kindergarten to deliver up to an additional 63 places for local children and families from Term 1 2027.

Cardinia Shire Council Deputy Mayor, Cr Liz Roberts welcomed the funding as a positive step forward for the community.

"Cardinia is grateful for the Building Blocks Partnership with the Victorian Government as it provides a framework for collaboration and co-investment in early years infrastructure which is particularly important in our growing region."

Cr Roberts said the expansion will ensure the facility is future-ready to meet growing community demand and the increased hours of kindergarten delivered as part of the Best Start, Best Life reforms.

"These upgrades will allow more children in Cockatoo to secure a kindergarten place and enjoy improved facilities that support their development."

Council is proud to work in partnership with the Victorian Government to deliver this project and welcomes the \$904,000 investment.

Additionally, to support this funding application, Council is working closely with Cockatoo Community House, also located at 23 Bailey Road, to relocate their services to the Cockatoo Community Complex. The move to the new location at 77 Pakenham Rd Cockatoo offers a larger, more functional space for Cockatoo Community House stakeholders and their various needs.

Child Online Safety Reform Welcomed.

Without Broader Action The introduction of legislation restricting social media access for under-16s by the Australian Government has been welcomed by the National Rural Health Alliance as an important first signal that it is willing to act on digital harm – but that is where the comfort stops, unless this is only the first step of a suite of changes. “We all wish for young people to be safe online, but banning under-16s from social media risks pushing them into unregulated spaces, cutting them off from support networks and placing the burden of policing technology onto families that are already stretched” comments Susi Tegen, Chief Executive of the National Rural Health Alliance. “Today’s legislative step is welcome, but it must not be the full stop – it must be the first comma. Real protection comes from regulating platforms, not punishing children. Build safety in; don’t legislate absence.” The NRHA maintains a need for a different approach, one that protects children and their mental health, without isolating them. “The real issue isn’t teenagers – it is the platforms designed to harvest attention, amplify harm and escape accountability” says Ms Tegen. Rural children in particular, often already isolated due to their postcode, rely greatly on social media for communication, expression and to get involved. Globally, leading child and youth advocates and parents have been warning for several years that holistic measures need to be in place. While a welcome start, the under-16s legislative ban is a band-aid on its own. “Children accessing social media are being drawn in by unsafe tech platforms that utilise manipulative algorithms. It is a problem that has already galloped ahead – unless stronger system responses follow in rapid succession,” Ms Tegen stresses. While the ban highlights public concern about exploitation, bullying, harmful body-image content and targeted commercial manipulation, the core issue is due to a lack of tech-corporate responsibility, with young people having already migrated to alternative platforms, VPN enabled tools and encrypted spaces that sit outside regulation.

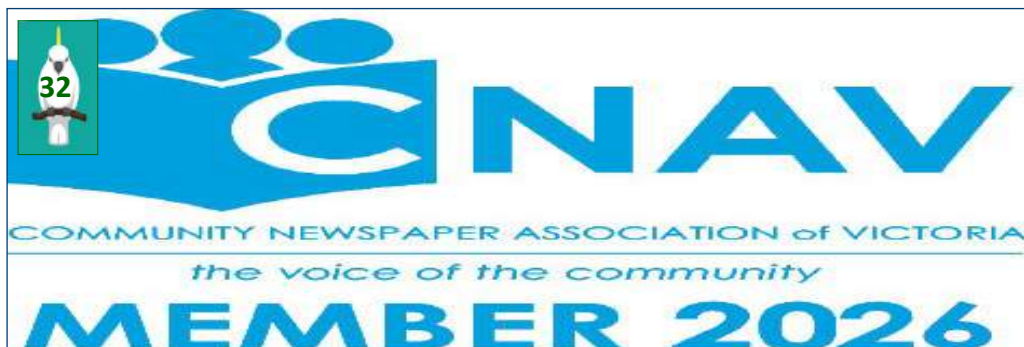

HARM A WORKER – FACE SERIOUS CONSEQUENCES

Daniela De Martino, Member for Monbulk, has thanked local retail workers for their hard work and reminded the community to treat customer-facing staff with respect - especially during the busy holiday season.

Daniela visited Woolworths in Monbulk recently to speak with staff about new laws aimed at protecting workers from abuse and violence. These reforms follow the passing of the **Crimes Amendment (Retail, Fast Food, Hospitality and Transport Worker Harm) Bill 2025** in Parliament last week.

Speaking on the Bill in Parliament, Daniela emphasised that no one should go to work fearing abuse or violence. She spoke about the vital role retail and hospitality workers play in local communities and said these reforms send a clear message that harming a worker will not be tolerated. Daniela also highlighted that the new laws give police stronger powers to act when abuse or intimidation occurs, ensuring workplaces are safer for everyone.

The Bill delivers tough new offences to crack down on crimes against workers in retail, hospitality and transport - making workplaces safer for everyone.

Under the reforms:

- Assaulting or threatening a retail, hospitality or transport worker will carry a penalty of up to **five years in jail**.
- New summary offences for intimidation and lower-level assaults will carry penalties of up to **six months in jail**.
- Ram raids will now be recognised as **aggravated burglary**, with a maximum penalty of **25 years** and subject to Adult Time for Violent Crime.
- Victoria will press ahead with **Workplace Protection Orders** to ban violent individuals from entire workplaces.

These changes respond to alarming statistics:

- **800,000 retail crime incidents** were reported nationally last year.
- Almost **9 in 10 retail workers** have experienced verbal abuse.



- More than half of transport gig workers report threatening or abusive behaviour.

The Allan Labor Government introduced the Bill to Parliament earlier this month, and it has now passed – delivering stronger protections for workers across Victoria ahead of the busy holiday season.

No worker deserves to be subjected to violence and aggression at work."

Let's make sure we treat the people who serve us every day with respect and kindness."

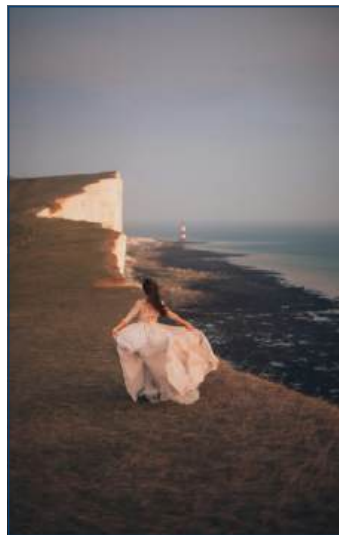

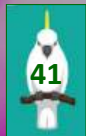

"Thank you to all community members who engaged with us earlier this year during the development of the RAP".

"Our third RAP builds on the progress we've made and reaffirms our commitment to reconciliation and strengthening relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples across the Shire. We encourage our community to review the draft plan and share their feedback" she says.

Council sets the agenda for advocacy priorities

Published: 17 December 2025

Cardinia Shire Council has set a bold vision for the future with the adoption of its Advocacy Agenda 2025–29 to drive Council’s advocacy efforts in the lead up to the 2026 State election and beyond.

The Advocacy Agenda is anchored by five priority projects across the shire that will headline Council’s 2026 Victorian State election campaign – Cardinia Life regional basketball and gymnastics stadium redevelopment, Lang Lang truck bypass, strategic road sealing package, public transport package, and parks and open space package.

These key priorities, along with 13 additional initiatives, will underpin proactive advocacy opportunities over the next four years, shaping Council’s Federal Budget submission, strengthening the advocacy prospectus, and driving engagement with Members of Parliament, election candidates and key stakeholders to secure vital funding and support.

Cardinia Shire Deputy Mayor Cr Liz Roberts said Council remained committed to advocating for what the Cardinia Shire community needs.

“As one of Victoria’s fastest growing local government areas with a population that is expected to grow by 40,000 over the next 10 years, it’s vital that we continue to seek support and investment from other levels of government for what our community needs and deserves,” Deputy Mayor Roberts said.

“Our key priorities are projects that will support the growth of our community and address a number of critical needs across the shire.

“We need the support of other levels of government to make these projects a reality and make a positive difference to the lives of people across the shire.”

Overview of priority projects:

- **Cardinia Life regional basketball and gymnastics stadium redevelopment:** co-investment from the State and Federal governments is sought to deliver the \$60 million stage one redevelopment through an equal three-way funding partnership.
- **Lang Lang truck bypass:** \$57 million in funding is needed for a dedicated bypass for heavy vehicles that connects South Gippsland’s extractive industries to the South Gippsland Highway.
- **Strategic road sealing package:** co-investment from the State and Federal governments is required to seal priority unsealed roads across the shire to improve emergency access, community safety, and climate resilience.
- **Public transport package:** Council is advocating for improved bus services and public transport connections across Cardinia Shire to reduce car dependency, connect isolated communities to essential services and make it easier for people to commute to work.
- **Parks and open space package:** co-investment from the State and Federal governments is needed to deliver three critical open space projects that provide safe, inclusive recreation opportunities for young people and families across Cardinia Shire’s growth corridor.
- **Officer District Park:** \$7 million to deliver stage two.
- **PB Ronald Reserve, Pakenham:** \$10 million for stage one.
- **McMullen Recreation Reserve, Officer:** \$10 million.

Puffing Billy, Australia's most beloved heritage train and one of the world's best-preserved steam railways has today celebrated its 125th anniversary.

Puffing Billy welcomes over 487,000 passengers annually and more than 11 million people have experienced the railway since its reopening in 1962.

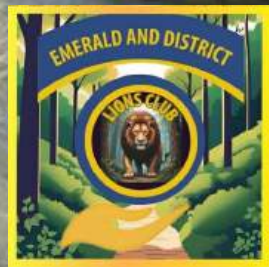
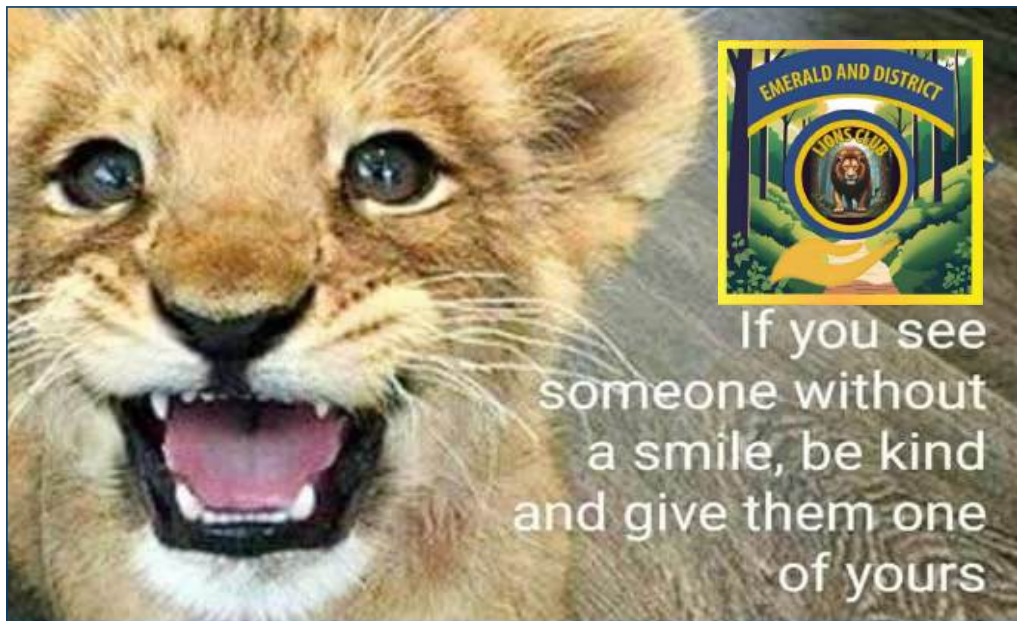

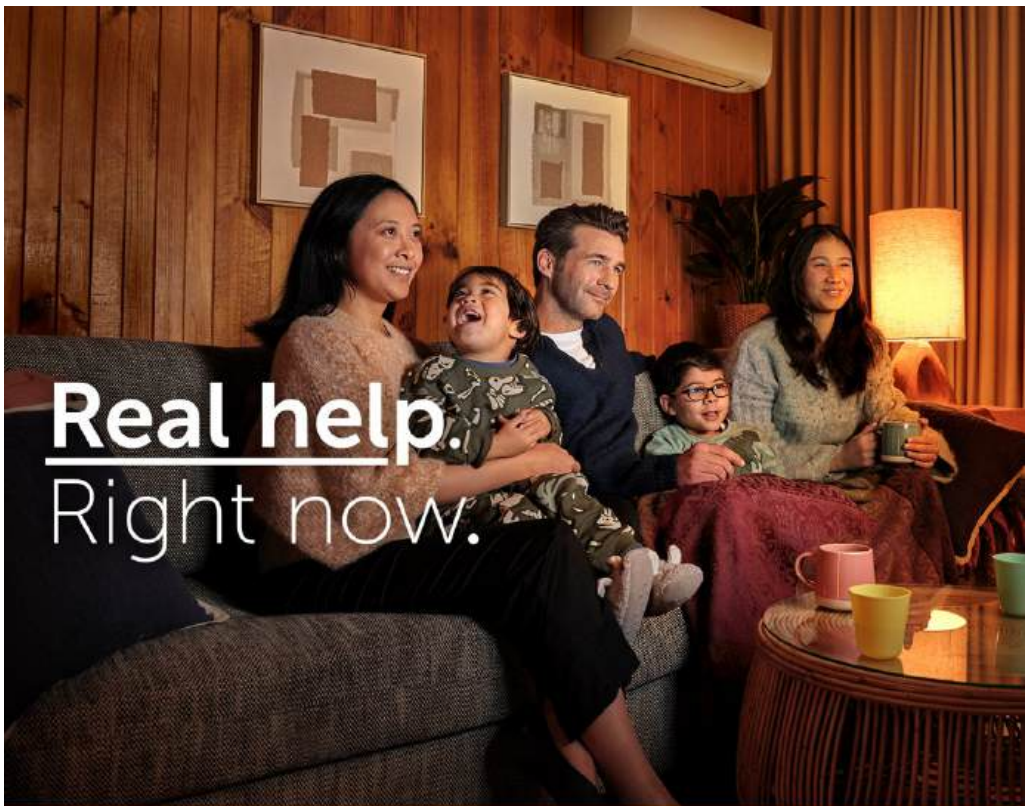
